Health and Safety

Lateral Flow Tests

We are pleased to advise that you will be able to pick up test kits next Tuesday morning (13 July), on the playground on your way in or out of school. Families can take two boxes and we plan to offer more days before the end of term, depending on the uptake. These tests are really important to help identify the virus in those who are asymptomatic and thus help reduce the risk of spread in the school and the community. We are aware that many of you already carry out these tests on a regular basis.

This week in Nursery we have been looking at one of my favourite stories. "Whatever Next" The children have been making lists of all the things that we would need to take with us on a visit to the moon.






Year 4
