Lateral Flow Tests

On Tuesday and Thursday this week we gave out hundreds of Lateral Flow Tests to parents and we were really pleased with the take up. These tests are really important to help identify the virus in those who are asymptomatic and thus help reduce the risk of spread in the school and the community. We are aware that many of you already carry out these tests on a regular basis.


Reception

Last week in Reception the children were encouraged to write their own little stories. We talked about the simple structure of stories and the children have had a go at creating their own character, exciting event, problem and resolution. In RE lessons, the children have explored the question 'What does it mean to belong to a faith community?'. They have learnt about sacred objects, explored charity work some religious communities do and found out about Baptisms and weddings.

A Message from the Admin Team

From September we are delighted to be able to offer all children from Reception – Year 6 a hot meal. Reception – Year 2 are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals and Years 3 to Year 6 are charged at £2.20 per day (£11 per week).

We will require all parents to pre book their child's lunch option each week on the School Gateway whether they have a hot meal or a packed lunch this will save time in the classroom each morning. Meals are available to book up until 8am on the day.
