Health and Safety

Lateral Flow Tests for your child and family are widely available free of charge. These tests are really important to help identify the virus in those who are asymptomatic and thus help reduce the risk of spread in the school and the community. We are aware that many of you already carry out these tests on a regular basis. So far we have provided hundreds of test kits to parents on the playground and we will continue to do so, for as long as we are able to obtain them. Year 1



Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have been finishing our work on writing our pirate diary based on the Pirate Cruncher. We moved onto subtracting in Maths and have used our base ten materials along with our number lines to help us. After half term we will be working hard on the column method for subtraction. We have finished our Light and Dark topic in Science and we are moving onto Rocks after half term. The children really enjoyed our Science topic especially making our shadow puppets. Next term in English we will be reading Fantastic Mr Fox and writing a setting description. In Humanities the children will be moving on from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.
