Reception

Well done to all Reception children for their first full week at school. We are really pleased with how well they have settled and adapted to their new routines. They had their first PE, art and music lessons on Thursday this week and seemed to really enjoy them! They have begun to make new friends and learn the names of all of their new class members. Next week we will begin teaching our Read, Write Inc lessons where the children will begin to learn how to read and write letter sounds. Year 1

Year 1 have enjoyed reading the story 'Oi dog!' in English lessons. We have written some sentences to tell parts of the story, focusing on our spelling. In Maths, we have been sorting and counting objects. We thought of our own ways to put objects and pictures into groups. We have had a Geography launch afternoon. In Geography, we have been introduced to human features and physical features and found some examples of these around school. Year 1 have learnt about Queen Elizabeth II and completed some artwork based around the queen in the 1960s.

Year 2

Year 2 have had another lovely week this week. We are impressed with how the children are trying to adapt to new routines and the expectations of the Year 2 curriculum. We started our week with a launch day to launch our new History topic. The children explored what life was like in Anglo-Saxon times and carried out jobs to earn golden coins. They were frustrated when their coins were taken for taxes and they couldn't afford to buy any food! We also celebrated the life of Queen Elizabeth II by researching what had happened to her during the 1970s. The children were fascinated to see how the silver jubilee celebrations were similar to the platinum jubilee celebrations we had earlier this year. We created artwork to share with the rest of the school. In English, the children enjoyed predicting what would happen in our new story "The Sea Monster." They were given the front cover as a jigsaw puzzle and were all excited to suggest ideas for the story. We also looked at the features of a setting description as this is what the children will be aiming to write at the end of our topic. In Maths, the children enjoyed exploring numbers using different equipment. They were able to show how many tens and ones were in a number using diennes, numicon, straws and by drawing pictures. We also recapped on writing numbers in numerals and words. Please could you also start practicing the 10 X table with your child. We will begin testing next week. Please could we also remind you to label your child's jumpers and

cardigans as we are having lots being misplaced. Thank you for your support.

Class Teacher Messages...

Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic week this week. We have started a great book in Literacy called The Pirate Cruncher and are really enjoying it. We have been learning how to use adjectives in our writing to describe the fierce pirates in the story, we love practising our pirate voice. In Maths we have started Place Value and each lesson used practical equipment to help our learning. The children have worked really hard to represent the different range of numbers. We have also begun our History topic of Stone Age and spent a whole afternoon exploring different parts of the era. We learnt what they ate, how they hunted for food and what houses they lived in. In Science we started our Rocks topic and the children were able to identify the difference between Sedimentary, Metamorphic and Igneous rocks whilst being able to explore them using their smell and touch senses in the classroom. All the teachers are really proud of how the children have settled in over the past two weeks. Well done Year 3 you are superstars!

Year 4

In Year 4 this week, we have started to read a new book called 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons' and have made predictions about what will happen next. We have also been learning the skills of adjectives and subordinating conjunctions, as we will be writing a story ending at the end of the unit. In maths, we have been learning about place value of numbers to 1,000, including how to partition numbers into thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. We have also started to learn about the Ancient Egyptians in History and States of Matter in science.

Year 5

Another fantastic week in year 5. In maths this week, the children have been reminding themselves about the significance of place value in number, in English, we have begun exploring our new text, 'Friend or For' by looking at the front cover and blurb as well as diving into chapter one and answering some retrieval questions.

Also in year 5, the children have taken part in a World War II history launch afternoon. The children watched videos, designed their own gas masks and walked a mile in the shoes of a child evacuee. The children were all exceptionally well behaved whilst walking around the school site.



Year 6

It's only the second week in Year 6 and we have already been really focusing on our learning and we have produced some fantastic work. For maths and English, we have now arranged the children into sets so that we can ensure all children receive the right level of education to challenge them and enable them to reach their full potential. In English, we have started reading our new book called 'Skellig' and made some predictions about the front cover. To commemorate the Queen, we have been working on some artwork to celebrate the most recent decade of her life. We have launched our history topic on the ancient civilization of Maya and looked at some ceremonial masks - we even designed our own using some of the features we discussed including Maya symbols, different animals and bright colours. In science, we are going to be learning about the human body and circulatory system so we started off this topic by looking at the organs we might find and discussing all of their different functions and how they all work together to keep us alive. We even used some augumented reality to look inside

the human body.

At Whitmore Park, reading is at the heart of our curriculum and we want to ensure that every child has a love of reading. Reporting Absence & Appointments
