Nursery


Mrs McShane






Year 1

Miss Skidmore (Year 1 Leader), Miss Allison and Mrs Corbett

Year 1 have continued to write about the Oi Dog story in English lessons and they have been focusing on using capital letters and full stops. In Maths, Year 1 have been counting amounts of specific objects and they have been recognising 2D shapes in Arithmetic lessons. The children in Year 1 learnt what a 'bird's eye view' is in Geography and they were able to draw a map of the classroom from a bird's eye view perspective. In RHE, the Year 1 children thought of some really good ideas about their responsibilities within school. The Year 1 teachers were very impressed that the children were able to think of a variety of ways to keep everyone safe and to help each other to learn.



Year 2

Tens and Ones Place Value Grid

This week in our Maths lessons, we have been recognising tens and ones in two digit numbers. We have been using tens and ones charts and part whole models to do this. The children have really enjoyed using base 10 to represent the tens and ones. We have also been continuing to learn the 10 X table. The children enjoyed the challenge of completing their first times tables test this week!

In our English lessons, we have been carrying on reading "The Sea Monster." We were amazed to discover that the sea monster was actually a good character. The children also wrote their own setting descriptions based on a picture from the story. They used lots of exciting adjectives to make their work more interesting.

In Science, the children enjoyed describing different materials. They used words like hard, strong, rough and bumpy to describe wood, glass and metal. They then discussed what the materials could be used for. In History, the children were given a picture of a mystery woman from history. They created their own questions to find out more about her. The children can't wait to find out who she is next week and why we are learning about her!

Year 3

Year 3 have had another fantastic week and are working hard. This week we have continued our work on a pirate diary in literacy, ready to write independently next week. We have targeted adjectives and conjunctions in our writing. In maths, we have continued to learn about place value and the children have learnt how to partition and make numbers to 1000. In humanities we have continued to learn about the stone age, and we have also looked at number lines and how the stone age fits into history. Lots of children received their reading at home 5 times stamp and can begin to collect them towards a new book. Thankyou for your on going support at home.

Year 4

In English this week, we have been learning how to set out a conversation between two characters using inverted commas and collected adjectives to use in descriptions. In maths, we have been representing and partitioning numbers to 10,000. The times tables we have been learning this week is the 4X and next week we will be learning the 8X. In history, we have started to ask questions about Ancient Egyptian society and discussing what a civilisation is. In science, we have learnt the difference between solids, liquids and gasses. In RHE, we are starting to learn what makes a good school citizen.

Year 5

This week in year 5, we have continued working on our place value knowledge in maths, the children have been looking at numbers to 1,000,000 and considering the importance of the place holders. In English, we have continued diving into our text Friend or Foe by Michael Morpurgo. Children have been exploring the thoughts and feelings of various characters and thinking about their descriptive techniques in their writing.

In History, we have been looking at the reasons why WWII started and in Science the children have been introduced to their new topic on materials.

5Delta and 5Beta start their swimming lessons on Monday 26th September. 5Gamma will then start their swimming lessons on Monday 10th October.

Year 6

Mrs Sandhu (Assistant Head and Year 6 Leader), Mr Payne (Assistant Head and Year 6 Leader) and Miss Knowles

Another fantastic week for Year 6 this week! We started our week by discussing the funeral for Queen Elizabeth II and it was so nice to hear about how so many of the children spent their day watching the funeral and remembering the Queen. We have been continuing our work on place value in maths and the children are really settling into their groups and enjoying learning lots about numbers up to 10,000,000. In English, we have been continuing to read the book 'Skellig' and are building up to writing a character description as we learn more about this mysterious character. We have already looked at what makes a great character description and have read an example of a description of Gollum. The children have had some great fun discussing vocabulary that they can use to describe these gruesome characters. In our afternoon lessons, we have been busy becoming both a human timeline and the circulatory system. We learnt all about when the Maya civilization happened in history, and we moved around the classroom pretending to be blood taking oxygen to all of the organs in science!
