
Whitmore Park Newsletter

Important Information Safety Notice – School Parking and School Car Park

Recently we have noticed a number of cars that are tail-gating onto school site and requesting to access via the gate intercom.

I would like to politely remind parents/carers that only blue badge holders are allowed on site for drop-off and collection of children.

Anyone who is not a blue badge holder, bringing a car to collect children, will need to park safely and responsibility on the road, avoiding blocking any driveways or parking on yellow or zig-zag lines.

If you have a blue badge, please wait in your car at the gate and inform the member of staff in the office via the gate intercom, by giving them your name and confirming that you have a blue badge before entering site. Please note the school office closes at 4.30pm.

Please can blue badge holders park in one of the allocated disabled parking bays provided in the main car-park and display the blue badge clearly in the front windscreen.

Please can anyone using the staff car park, drive carefully within the 5 mile per hour speed limit, park responsibility and avoid blocking other cars in.

We are in the process of updating our list of blue badge holders. If you would like to be included on the list please arrange to bring your blue badge to the school office during opening times of 8am-4.30pm.

Reception

This week in Reception we have been busy learning about Autumn. We have been on some Autumn walks around the school grounds to look for changes that are occurring to the environment during this season. We have talked about the changing trees, leaves and the weather. The children enjoyed collecting lots of different leaves ready to use in the creative area next week. In our Read, write Inc lessons we have learned the sounds 'h, sh, r and j'. In Numeracy we have been learning to compare small quantities using sentences such as "3 is a bigger number because it has more" or "this tower has fewer cubes". We have also been looking at triangles and circles using vocabulary such as 'straight sides', 'curved, round side' and 'corners'. In the classroom, children have made Halloween inspired skeleton pictures using cotton buds and have practised their cutting skills when making pumpkins and pumpkin faces. Year 1

Year 1 have been writing about the story Mrs Armitage on wheels. In Maths, they have been learning to add numbers together; they have been thinking carefully about what each number in a number sentences means. Year 1 have had their History launch afternoon. Our new topic is Transport. We will be looking at how cars and bikes have changed over time. In Science, Year 1 went on an Autumn walk around the school grounds and looked for signs of Autumn. In RHE, they have explored how people can be similar are different.

Year 2

It has been a lovely start back at school this week. The children have settled back in beautifully and have all come back ready to learn. We had a launch day to launch our new Geography topic about the United Kingdom. We went on a "tour" of all the countries in the UK. The children all had pretend passports and drove to different parts of England, got on a plane to Northern Ireland, took a long train journey to Scotland and drove around some of the beautiful areas in Wales. On our travels, the children found out about the human and physical features of the different countries. They enjoyed listening to the story of the Loch Ness monster and how Giant's Causeway was formed in Northern Ireland. We are looking forward to learning more about the UK in the next few weeks. In English, we had a talent show to introduce our new book "Amazing Grace." The children then used picture clues to make predictions about what they thought might happen in the story. They wrote lovely pieces of advice to Grace when they learnt her classmates said she couldn't be Peter Pan in the school pantomime. In Maths, we are continuing to learn about addition and subtraction. We used equipment and pictures to show the number sentences. We also found quick methods to add by looking for number facts. We are now learning our division facts for the 10 times table. We have had a practise week this week and the children will have their first test next week. Please could you practise this at home with your child. This term, the children are also taking part in Skills Academy. The children have all chosen a club they would like to attend for the half term. The clubs include: dance, drama, music, Spanish, lego and art. It was lovely to see how enthusiastic the children were and how well they worked together in teams.

Year 3

Year 3 have had a great work . All the children have worked hard, and we have been discussing this half terms value focus of respect! During the week we have continued our story work on 'The true story of the three little pigs' and have targeted writing speech with all the correct punctuation. We have also continued our work in maths about addition and subtraction and introduced column addition and subtraction. We have continued our focus on the 3 times tables. In science we have started a new topic about light and next week we will begin some experiment investigating shadows. We had a great half day of geography learning about the countries and cities of the UK.

Year 4

In year 4 this week, we have started to read a new book called 'The Spider and the Fly.' This is a cautionary tale about keeping safe. We have used our reading skills to predict how the story will end and develop our understanding of the main characters. We have practised the skill of prepositions and written our own version of the story opening. In maths this week, we have been working on subtraction with more than one exchange and formal methods for multiplication of two-digit numbers by a one-digit number. We have started a new geography topic 'Our Local Area,' in which we will be learning how and why the geography of Coventry has changed over time. In science, we have been learning about the Water Cycle and we have started a new RE topic which is all about Sikhism.

On Monday, we started the week investigating reversible and irreversible changes in Science, we have published our letters to Michael Morpurgo in English and have continued to develop our understanding of addition and subtraction up to 1,000,000 in maths. This week we have paused our History learning around WWII after asking questions relating to their previous learning and briefly learning about the Battle of Britain. We will pick this topic up again after Christmas.

In RE this week, the children have shown great maturity when focussing on the meaning of 'Prejudice' and the impact this had on people during the second World War.
