## Reception

This week the Reception children visited the Immanuel Christian Centre as part of our learning about people, communities and celebrations. The children made us so proud by walking so sensibly to the church. Their behaviour and listening when we got there was great too! We learned a little bit about the church and what some of the people who attend the church believe. In Read, write inc we have learned new sounds... v, y, w, th. Please practise reading and writing these at home (see Seesaw for more information). In Numeracy we have learned all about the number 4 with help from Freddie Four. We have looked at the composition of 4 and are beginning to say sentences such as '3 and 1 make 4, 1 and 1 and 1 make 4!'

Numberblocks has also helped our understanding with this. We hope that you have a great weekend - please remember to keep up the daily reading at home and to sign reading diaries. If your child reads 5 times within the week, they will recieve a sticker for their bookmark.

### Year 1

This week, Year 1 have continued to write about the story 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels'. They have focused on using capital letters and full stops in the correct places. In Maths, they have been learning how to recognise and make number bonds to different numbers. In Science, Year 1 explored the difference between the properties shiny and dull and sorted objects based on these properties. In History, Year 1 looked closely at old cars and new cars and recognised some ways they are different. In RE, the children learnt about some Christian beliefs. They explored a story from the Bible and they did some drama to re-tell the story.



#### Year 2

Year 2 have amazed their teachers with their Maths this week. We have had a missing numbers week! The children used a variety of different methods to solve number sentences and then applied these methods to problem solving questions. They are getting more and more confident at choosing the correct method to solve a problem. In English, we have been concentrating on reading comprehension skills. We have been retrieval detectives. Ask your child what this means! The children showed their understanding of Amazing Grace by answering questions. They were excited to find out that Grace's dream came true and she got the part in her school play. The children are looking forward to writing their story retells about Amazing Grace next week. In Geography, the children were shocked to find out that Santa's elves had been in the classroom already!



They had found out that the elves had chopped up maps of the United Kingdom. The children worked in groups to piece the puzzles back together and then labelled the countries and the capital cities. We also wrote notes to Zog to let him know which season in the UK would be best for him to land his spaceship. We looked at different weather reports to help us decide. In Science, we learnt about Charles Macintosh and why he is important. We wrote fact files about him and were amazed to discover that rain macs were named after him. As the weather is getting colder, please can we remind you to send your child to school with their coat. Hats, scarves and gloves also need to be labelled with your child's name.

## Year 3

In year 3, we have continued our reading and writing based on the story of 'The True Story of the Three Pigs '. The children will be writing their own version of this twist on a fairy-tale next week . The skills we have learnt in this unit are inverted commas and time adverbs. In reading we have continued to learn the skill of retrieval and began to learn about inference. In maths we have been learning column addition and column subtraction with renaming of 10s and 100s. In Science, we have learnt about how shadows are formed and how to change the size of a shadow. In geography, we have been learning about the different counties and regions of the UK. We have looked at some landmark physical features and human features for some of these regions. e.g. the lakes of Cumbria in the Lake District (physical feature), Tower Bridge in greater London (human feature)



## Year 4

In Year 4 this week, we have continued to read the 'The Spider and the Fly.' We have learnt when and how to change paragraphs, how to use fronted adverbials for time and how to identify a characters emotions through what they do and say. In maths, we have learnt what area is and how to calculate it by counting squares or multiplying rows by columns. In science, we have carried out an investigation into gases in liquids. In geography, we have learnt how to use Eastings and Northings to read maps. This has helped us with our understanding of co-ordinates, and we have started to read maps showing our local area. In RE, we have continued to learn about what Sikh's believe.

## Year 5





#### Year 6

Another fantastic week for Year 6! We looked at different animals and their habitats and analysed their characteristics to see how they help them to survive. In RHE we have been learning about consequences of behaviour and using some roleplay to come to a decision as a class about the consequences of people's actions. In Geography this week, we continued our work on North and South America and looked Mrs Sandhu (Assistant Head at the physical and human features of the continents and how these might have a positive or negative impact on the area around them. YEAR 4 = 4 BETA (56%)


YEAR 5 = 5 DELTA (60%)


