Health and Safety Notices

Head Lice

Recently, we have seen an increase in Head Lice cases in school. While it is a common issue among primary school children, it can be very frustrating, and costly, to treat regularly. Please see the advice below from the School Nursing Team about how to prevent Head Lice. It is important that we all work together to actively try to prevent the spread of Head Lice in school. Please contact Mrs Smith if you have concerns about Head Lice or if you need further advice. You can purchase a lice comb from your pharmacy or from Amazon.

HOW TO FIND AND GET RID OF HEAD LICE

- 1. Wash hair as normal.
- 2. Put conditioner on, and comb through the hair with a normal comb.
- 3. Section/part hair.
- 4. Using a head lice comb, comb all the way down the hair shaft from the scalp to the end.
- 5. After every comb, wipe away with a tissue.
- 6. This must be done on every section of hair.
- 7. Rinse out the conditioner.
- 8. This can be repeated every 3 4 days over a 2 3 week period.
- 9. This method should also be used **once a week** to check for Head Lice, even if you think your children doesn't have this.

Reception



This week in Reception the children have been creating story maps to help them to learn the story 'A Christmas Star'. In Numeracy, we have been learning about the number 5 with help from Fiona Five! In our Read write inc lessons we have learnt the sounds z, ch, qu and x. In the classroom, some children have chosen to make boats for 'Freddie Four', they have also been practising how to match CVC words to pictures. Please remember to send in reading books next week so that they can be changed. We will be doing a little assessment next week to see how well the children are retaining the read, write inc sounds. We will send it home so that you can practise at home too. We hope that you have a great weekend!

Year 1

Year 1 have started re-telling the story 'Little Red Riding Hood' in their English lessons. They thought of some fantastic sentences to write and they have started using 'and' to join sentences together. In Maths, they have been solving addition word problems. They had to work out what the question was asking them to do and use objects and drawing to help them solve the problem. In History, Year 1 have learnt what 'sources' are and learnt that we can use them to find information. In Science, Year 1 explored the properties 'waterproof' and 'transparent' and carried out an investigation to see which materials are waterproof. This week has been anti-bullying week. The children role-played different scenarios and thought about what advise they would give to the children in the scenarios. They also practised phrases they could say if they thought someone was bullying them or someone else and made an anti-bullying poster. They thought of some great ideas!

Year 2

This week has been anti-bullying week at school. The children were introduced to this on Monday in our whole school assembly. Lots of the children also wore odd socks to start the week. We designed our own odd socks and wrote about what makes a good friend. This week in English, the children wrote their story about "Amazing Grace." They tried really hard to include lots of conjunctions and adjectives to make their writing more interesting. The teachers were so impressed that they sent some children to Mrs Squires to receive Headteacher's awards. In Maths, we have been continuing to learn about addition and subtraction. The children learnt a special trick to do if they were subtracting and didn't have enough ones. Ask your child what this is. We have also been exploring missing number problems in arithmetic. Lots of the children challenged themselves to use known facts to solve their problems.

In Science, we investigated which materials were bendy. The children placed weights on different materials to see if they would bend. They found out that plastic was bendy but not objects made out of plastic are bendy. In Geography, the children chose one of the countries in the UK and wrote a non-chronological report about it. The children enjoyed researching about their country to surprise their readers with fascinating facts. Next week at school is Cultures week. We are looking forward to exploring a surprise culture with the children and creating lots of artwork around this!

Year 3

In Year 3 we have written our own version of 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs'. Look out for some of these stories on our school Twitter. In Maths, we have consolidated addition and subtraction. Also, we have been applying our skills in helping us to solve word problems. In Science we looked at our results from the shadow investigation and drew conclusions. In Geography, we had the opportunity to research about the West Midlands. The children have produced some great fact files! This week we have also had a focus on Anti-bullying, we discussed what bullying is and how to prevent it. The national theme this year has been 'Reach out' where children are encouraged to tell a trusted adult if they feel bullied. Look out for another tweet about the work we have done around Anti-bullying.

Year 4

In Year 4 this week, we have finished reading 'The Spider and the Fly.' We have written in role as the spider, writing his diary entry for the end of the story. We have tried to include all the skills we have learnt over the last few weeks, including fronted adverbials and prepositions. We have also been working on our reading and well done to all those children who have brought their book in every day. In maths this week, we have started to explore the 3,6 and 9 times-tables and how they are related. We have also completed two lessons for Anti-Bullying Week along the theme of 'Reach Out.'

Year 5

We started the week with an assembly introducing 'Anti-bullying week'. Together we had a discussion about reaching out and completed various activities on Wednesday afternoon. Also, I have been very impressed by how the children have shown maturity and behaved really well when they have had to stay inside for wet playtimes this week. In English this week, we have continued to read 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. Children have helped their teachers with ideas whilst writing a playscript and they have focused on building their retrieval skills and vocabulary understanding in their reading lessons. In Maths, the children have been working hard on their knowledge of multiplication. They have been developing their understanding of factors alongside multiples of numbers and applying these skills to solve various problems. During our Science lesson, where the children have been focusing on states of matter, we

planned our own investigation for our next lesson where we will test the reaction between white vinegar and bicarbonate of soda. Finally, it has been wonderful to see the children in their spots today as we try to raise

money for Children in Need. A huge thank you to all of you for your continued support and for giving to such a worthy cause! Have a wonderful weekend.

Reading



At Whitmore Park, reading is at the heart of our curriculum and we want to ensure that every child has a love of reading. To help children in school to achieve this, we want every child to read...read...read.

The expectation is for children to be reading at least 5 times every week; reading diaries need to be signed by an adult to show how many times children have read. Reading diaries also need to be in school every day so we can see that children are reading daily.

Winning classes for last week for children reading the most were:

YEAR 1 = 1 BETA (48%)
YEAR 2 = 2 GAMMA (67%)
YEAR 3 = 3 DELTA (72%)
YEAR 4 = 4 BETA (52%)
YEAR 5 = 5 DELTA (63%)
YEAR 6 = 6 GAMMA (57%)

All of these children will receive an extra 5 dojo points and 5 minutes of extra playtime in the week!

In assembly this week, Mr Johnston spoke to the children about Anti-bullying Week and how important it is to reach out and talk to an adult if you are ever concerned about this.

So, this week's recommendation is themed around Anti-Bullying week. It is called 'The Small Things' by Lisa Thompson.


